

Parents wishing to home educate their children will submit all required documents to the Superintendent (if parents select the Superintendent as the participating agency). The Superintendent will acknowledge in writing when all required documents are filed. The Superintendent will receive a required annual evaluation of each home-educated student by July 1.

Home-educated students shall have access to in-school courses or programs in SAU #16 in the same manner as other full-time students, provided the addition of the home educated student does not displace a full-time student from a course or program.

Home-educated students shall not be denied the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities if the student fulfills the following conditions:

- The student must meet all school district and state eligibility requirements as outlined by the NHIAA with the exception of school attendance.
- The student shall be required to fulfill the same responsibilities and standards of behavior and performance, including related calls or practice requirements, of other students participating in the interscholastic activity of the team and shall be required to meet the same standards for acceptance on the team. The student must also comply with all public school requirements during participation.

Parents deciding to re-enroll their children into the School District following a period of home education will make arrangements with the Principal for an evaluation to determine appropriate placement in the District's program.

Parents should be attentive that when re-enrolling a student, there may be discrepancies between the home schooling level of achievement and the scope and sequence of the District's curriculum.

The School Board will not award certificates or diplomas to home educated students. Students must enter the regular school program and complete all necessary graduation requirements of the District and the State to be eligible for a certificate or diploma.
